JESSICA JAMROZ is an award-winning, internationally recognized design practitioner who has mastered the art of melding multiple intellectual traditions in the service of creating culturally significant work. The nexus behind numerous high-profile public and controversial projects, she has directed nearly a billion dollars of design and construction in the past ten years alone, acting in the roles of Master Planner, Architect, and Owners' Executive Representative for world-class organizations and government agencies.

Ms. Jamroz has been working professionally in the fields of Master Planning and Architecture since 1998. In 2004, she joined Frederic Schwartz Architects after winning the international competition for the State of New Jersey's September 11th Memorial, a design she co-authored with Frederic Schwartz. Modern Operations LLC clients include the Albright-Knox Art Gallery, the Academy Museum of Motion Pictures Arts and Sciences, the Broad, and ARUP Canada.

Ms. Jamroz's architecture and planning work includes the design and construction of Empty Sky: New Jersey's September 11th Memorial, located directly across the Hudson River from Ground Zero and on the same shoreline as the Statue of Liberty and Ellis Island in Liberty State Park. She directed a New Orleans office set up immediately after Hurricane Katrina, where she managed and coordinated a maze of consultants and hundreds of thousands of residents in the work of the Unified New Orleans Plan—a recovery and rebuilding plan for 9,200 acres and 43% of the post-Katrina population. She formulated the design and directed construction of The Rising: Westchester County September 11th Memorial in White Plains, NY. She led a 47-person THINK team in the Master Planning for a two-million person sustainable City of Steel in Jamshedpur, India, for the Tata Steel family. From Dec 2016 to March 2018 she acted as the Owners' primary Executive Representative (OMA / Shohei Shigematsu was the architect) for the \$160 million-dollar museum expansion project for the Albright-Knox Art Gallery, the sixth oldest public art institution in the United States, involving a 225,000 SF footprint of restoration and new construction.

From 2011-2017, Ms. Jamroz, a board member of the Ramirez Solar House 501(c)(3), spearheaded the organization, administration, and restoration work for the earliest U.S. Solar House in extent in coordination with the Secretary of the Interior's Standards and Guidelines for Archeology and Historic Preservation. As a leader of the nonprofit organization partnered with the National Park Service to preserve, restore, and educate the public on the Ramirez Solar House—Jessica created a "Center of Sustainability" at the house with workshops and discussions on sustainability in residential design and the environment.
